Who Me, An Elder?

Information for this article came from *Your Calling as an Elder* by Gary Straub, p. 9-10.

Two books that are very helpful on the subject of Elder Qualification are: The Ministry of Elders (Edwin Linberg and Rod Parrott) and Disciples Eldership (Peter Morgan). Both books give practical help to the matter of qualification. Questions revolving around "how literally" to take the apostolic teachings often bring up even larger questions. "Don't just take these biblical standards literally; take them seriously! Ponder them long and hard. Question the original meanings. Study the context and history. Dig out the grammar. Spare no expense to gain the best understanding you can possess. Be satisfied that you are what Paul calls "a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly explaining the word of truth" (2 Tim. 2:15). When you complete your exhaustive studies, the toughest task will still be to apply the interpretive wisdom: How does this revealed truth fit the life and leadership of the potential elder who is before us as a candidate?"

Who Me, A Deacon?

Information for this article came from *Your Calling as a Deacon* by Gary Straub and James Trader II, pp. 21-22.

The qualifications for Deacon in 1 Timothy 3:8-13 can be overwhelming. It's a dream list, really. "No individual person will ever be able to fulfill perfectly all the qualifications listed there. What is important is that we strive to be the best at each of these gualifications. To understand the gifts we do have, and to use them in the best ways possible." Through the years, many of the qualifications listed have been used to exclude individuals from the diaconate, ranging from being married only once, to excluding women. Take a look at the qualifications and see where you fit in. What qualities do you already possess? What are others to strive for? What needs to be forgiven by the grace of God?

Spotlight on Disciples

The Christian System

Information for this article came from Journey in Faith by Lester G. McAllister and William E. Tucker, pp. 155-156.

Even though Alexander Campbell never referred to himself as a theologian, he certainly was one. He aspired to be "the finest scholar in the Kingdom," and made known his understanding of Christianity through his journals and in his debates. In 1835, he published a synthesis of this thought entitled, *A Connected View of the Principles by which the Living Oracles May Be Intelligibly and Certainly Interpreted.* It was retitled *The Christian System.* It provided a comprehensive statement on biblical doctrine which served as a textbook for generations of Disciples preachers.

He firmly believed that he avoided the trap of "human opinion" in interpreting the biblical witness. He wrote, "While, then, we would, if we could . . . proclaim all that we believe, and all that we know, to the ends of the earth, we take the Bible, the whole Bible, and nothing but the Bible, as the foundation of all Christian union and communion. Those who do not like this, will please show us a more excellent way."

Campbell was deeply criticized that he had written a creed for Disciples. He countered: "We speak for ourselves only; and while we are always willing to give a declaration of our faith and knowledge of the Christian system, we firmly protest against dogmatically propounding our own views, or those of any fallible mortal, as a condition or foundation of church union and co-operation." Unlike a creed that would be used as a test for accepting or rejecting persons to Christian fellowship, *The Christian System* could be accepted or rejected without affecting one's status in the church.
