Food Pantry Yearly Recap


The First Christian Church helped 530 families consisting of 1,437 people with 552 bags of food in 2017. Of these 530 families, 108 were new to us. (Just began tracking "new to us" in August.)

In addition to the bags of food we gave out 244 dozen eggs, 35 pounds of potatoes, garden tomatoes, cucumbers and fresh pears.

The months with the highest usage was November with 58, October with 56 and August with 54 families. The lowest months were February with 29, March with 32 and April with 33 families.

Talk about awesome! Thank you First Christian Church family for caring about our community and helping our Senior Citizens and the working poor with food.


The IHOP Dividend


