

Reflections



Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations: Revised and Updated by Robert Schnase. Nashville, Abingdon Press, 2018.

Robert Schnase is a United Methodist pastor and bishop and is the best-selling author of several books including this one.

Chapter 1: "Come and See" and "Go and Do"

The basic premise of this chapter is that as important as it is to make technical and adaptive changes to our building and way of doing things at church it is equally and perhaps more important to make adaptive changes in our preparation for and interaction with people in the community.

One congregation decided that "in order to fulfill their mission, the people in the congregation must adapt their ministries to the new context of their community." They stepped back and examined their habits of worship and began the hard work of seeing new ways of conceiving it.

They found courage, energy, and intentionality toward experimental approaches to worship; engaging the downtown business community; and adapting ministries. They reshaped their ministries to reach the homeless and the low-income community.

They found that "attractional models" were necessary to fulfill the mission of Christ, but were not enough. They must also develop ministries that derive from "missional assumptions" that benefit others who are not members of the church. They found that they needed to extend "radical hospitality" that "nudges us to form relationships of mutual respect and service."

Through God's grace, we can update our assumptions to extend Christ's hand to those outside our church community with creativity and flavor. We can break through our passivity to go, tell, teach, pray, give, heal, love, forgive, and baptize.

A missional focus gives the church an "ever restless" quality that grows and changes with the seasons. Making shifts in how we understand ministry will open us to new places and spaces and to take seriously our responsibility for carrying Christ's love out with "intentionality, grace, and humility."



Who Me, An Elder?

Information for this article came from Your Calling as an Elder by Gary Straub, p. 21-23. Here is Straub's continued brief interpretive summary of the biblical qualifications for elder leadership:

The Biblical Duties of an Elder At least 14 responsibilities can be found in scripture specifically mentioned as duties of the office.

6. Help the Weak. Acts 20:35 An elder reaches to the fringe of the congregation "to notice and connect with persons who may well need assistance, but will not ask. This type of caring isn't always convenient and may be messy. Philippians 2:5-11 reminds us about Jesus' servant spirit.

7. Give. Acts 20:35 Give generously. Love tithing. Give as a spiritual response to the blessings God gives you. Consider the tithe as a floor to your giving rather than the ceiling.

8. Tend the Flock. 1 Peter 5:2 "Elders are the resident, grassroots, and pastoral caregivers of the congregation." Learn people's names and call people by their name!
