This is an important year in our "Transition" as a congregation. The following information will give you an idea of what to expect as we continue along our journey.

Kansas Leadership Center Conference Coming Up

Our Kansas Disciples Region has provided a grant for members of Kansas Disciples congregations to attend leadership training conferences at the Kansas Leadership Center in Wichita. Our congregation is sending 5 people to 3 conferences beginning in August. We are very grateful to our insightful leaders of our region for providing this training for our Kansas Disciples. The hope is to equip leaders for the challenges of Transformational Ministry. This is a huge undertaking for the trainees. Please keep our people and this entire program in prayer.

The first conference, *Lead for Change*, is an extensive 7-day training in 2 sessions. Marlene Hanson, George Arnett, and Pastor Lorraine will attend **August 14-17 and October 23-25**. Each participant will have coach support as we work through the challenges of adaptive change.

<u>Jennifer Dalton and Nik Roth</u> will attend a 3-day training **November 7-9**. This class, **Your Leadership Edge**, will develop a new mindset to approaching tough problems associated with adaptive change.

Finally, <u>Pastor Lorraine</u> will attend *Equip to Lead*, October 18-19. This program is designed as a follow-up to the previous courses and will provide training for your pastor to equip our congregation to move forward through our transitional period.

Two others, <u>Jean Miller and Laurie Kurzen</u>, have received previous training through Kansas Leadership Center. Our circle of expertise grows with each person who understands these leadership concepts.

This training will be invaluable but is only the beginning of helping the entire congregation move forward. We need **EVERYONE** to take part in subsequent sessions. Please plan on attending congregational follow-up sessions designed to help us in becoming something new for God.

The Biblical Duties of an Elder

At least 14 responsibilities can be found in scripture specifically mentioned as duties of the office

3. Receive the Charge of the Holy Spirit. Acts 20:28

Elders watch for and are open to each other's Spiritual gifts. The Spirit may be offering an individual elder to equip the church for a particular season of struggle or service. An elder may be responding to the Spirit to lead a service assignment or be empowered by prayer to guide the shepherds of the flock in special intercession. "Hollowing out a space for the Spirit requires receptivity and surrender."

SPOTLIGHT ON DISCIPLES

Discord Leads to Division (part 3)

Division finally was the answer to the unrest over political, cultural, and theological differences intensifying throughout the post-Civil War period. The new movement, The Churches of Christ, was officially recognized in 1906 with 159,658 members. However, the process of separation had begun nearly 30 years before. The "Sand Creek Address and Declaration" repudiated the "many innovations" claiming to corrupting Disciples. Another declaration (1892) urged a statement in property deeds to prohibit instrumental music and "other equally defiling practices." Thomas R. Burnett made clear in 1895 in the *Gospel Advocate* to not litigate over church property, but to build cheap and comfortable chapels to improve later. He said, "It is better to have one dozen true disciples in a cheap house than a thousand apostate pretenders in a palace who love modern innovations better than Bible truths." In the meantime, the progressive James H. Garrison noted also in 1895 that "the organ and society questions were dead issues among the Disciples, 'We have passed beyond them and are confronting vastly more important questions." And so, the Disciples moved ahead, founding a number of organizations and agencies at the national level in order to coordinate the work of congregations as the 'brotherhood' continued its rapid growth into the 20th century.
