Reflections



Reaching People Under 30 While Keeping People Over 60: Creating Community Across Generations by Edward H. Hammett. TCP-Books.com., 2015.

Chapter 2: Church: A Hotel for Saints or a Hospital for Sinners?

Edward Hammett uses the example of the changes that the early church made to help us understand the changes the church needs to make in order to reach new people. He suggests that church folk become too comfortable, have turned their focus inward, and have

left behind their "first love" of "going and making disciples" (Matthew 28:19-20).

We need to break out of this cycle and take the following risks:

- Be willing to risk: how will the church thrive?
- Experiment with change.
- Become restless with the status quo.
- Be bold.
- Have a bias for action: do things that nobody else is willing to do.

Hammett is adamant that there are two critical factors in Reaching People under 30 While Keeping People over 60:

- 1. Practicing proven principles of effective intergenerational ministry.
- 2. Practicing consistent leadership styles and practices that creates a pull more than a push strategy that deepens the faith and function of the body of Christ.

Pull is about what draws and compels people forward. *Push* is about feeling dictated to and by others.

Finally, Hammett builds upon the Great Commission in four steps:

Come and see: take time to be with people to build relationships. "[Meet them] where they are, rather than where we want them to be . . . "

- 1. Come follow me: be ready to answer questions about Christ.
- 2. *Come be with me*: become a mentor. Take someone under your wing and teach them about Jesus.
- 3. Abide in me: strive to be like Jesus

Questions to consider

- How can I be the presence of Christ in the midst of the world, family, job and community I live in?
- How can the Christ in me meet and address the need in the world?
- What does it mean to rest in God's care and vision for you now?
- How can you follow Jesus' example in your circle of friends and family?

Information for this article came from Your Calling as an Elder by Gary Straub, p. 23-24. Here is Straub's continued brief interpretive summary of the biblical qualifications for elder leadership:

The Biblical Duties of an Elder

At least 14 responsibilities can be found in scripture specifically mentioned as duties of the office.

9. Exercise Oversight. 1 Peter 5:2

When problems arise, Elders are proactive and rise to meet them. They "lay claim to their spiritual responsibility and draw an appropriate boundary, while offering grace at the same time." Elders work with the pastor and offer creative solutions to anticipated problems.

10. Don't Lord It over the Flock. 1 Peter 5:3.

Be authentic. Elders demonstrate being a "real, down-to earth person' who has spiritual 'ups and downs' like everybody else . . . and lead out of the power of . . . [their genuine] spiritual influence."

Men and Missions

Information for this article came from Journey in Faith by Lester G. McAllister and William E. Tucker, pp.263-268.

It took a few years, but the men finally came together to discuss foreign missions. They organized a prayer committee and by the 1875 General Convention, they had ready a tentative constitution that was adopted. The Foreign Christian Missionary Society (FCMS) was born. From there, interest in foreign missions grew. Disciples tried for a while to send missionaries to European countries rather than to non-Christian lands to set up congregations. "Children's Day" was established from children's Sunday School offerings. The excitement over this offering that was collected once a year and the struggling FCMS fund nearly doubled by 1882. Archibald McLean's work for FCMS was remarkable. His efforts in foreign missions helped to spawn home missions. More congregations were planted in the west and in Canada. Work in Sunday schools and children's and youth programs began to flourish.
