## Reflections

It has been another interesting week at the Kansas Leadership Center (KLC) learning about "Teaching Leadership." The whole point of sending people to this training is so that we can have multiple voices speaking the same language as we move forward on our congregational transitional journey. The big and most powerful concept is that in order to work on adaptive and technical change together, we first need to make individual change. This is the challenge that is most difficult and is a life-long process. The KLC is not a religious organization, and these concepts are not new. They are, in fact, the work of every Christian. We are called to help people find Christ. In that finding, there is a change of heart, soul, and mind as we seek to know and love God.

As we walk with Jesus "on the way," we realize how hard the work is. It would make sense that if we are to be more productive in our work, we need to have a clear purpose, instill unity, and have a step-by-step plan (a blueprint) as to how to build whatever it is that comes next. That's technical work.

Adaptive work is different. The purpose is anything but clear and people's attitudes, ideas, and mindset become scattered and feel very unorganized. It's messy and scary and unpredictable. We have to make shifts in how we do things. The work is experimental and risky. It makes us feel irritable, uneasy, and overwhelmed. It makes us think, "Why did I ever agree to this?" "Why can't we just do things like we've always done them?" "I want my old church back!"

If you've been feeling anything like this over the last 18 months, don't worry—you're perfectly normal! The best thing is that God understands. God knows the work we're trying to do and I believe that God honors that work. God is here to comfort and guide us as we grieve over the loss of what we once knew to be church. God knows the struggles inside each and every one of us. God is here to help us through and is at the end of the tunnel. Let us hold onto our faith and trust that Jesus will guide us through.

Paul reminds us in Philippians 4:6-7: "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

I thank God that we all have each other to cling to as we climb, sometimes fall; walk, sometimes run; and swim, sometimes treading water. God bless us all as we continue to move forward with the Holy Spirit as our sail.



#### Who Me, An Elder?

Information for this article came from Your Calling as an Elder by Gary Straub, p. 25-27. Here is Straub's continued brief interpretive summary of the biblical qualifications for elder leadership:

#### The Biblical Duties of an Elder

At least 14 responsibilities can be found in scripture specifically mentioned as duties of the office.

#### 12. Call on the Sick. James 5:1

This pastoral duty is to be taken seriously. This is "job one." Elders call regularly on their flock either in person or by card, phone call, or digitally. This is not an option. Elders often take communion to homebound members.

#### 13. Be Teachable and Teaching. Titus 1:9

An Elder is a life-long learner of the faith. This is "requirement one." Teaching flows out of our quiet moments with God. "Listening with a heart ready to obey and joyfully putting into practice those insights gained from scripture, prayer, and conversation are what eldering is all about.

### 14. Exercise Faithfulness. 2 Timothy 2:2

An Elder shows up. "As leaders, those things we would not get around to do 'just because we felt like it,' we would graciously do because it is part of our communal understanding that we are Christ's body in the world: his (arthritic) hands, his (tired) feet, his (broken) heart." Faithful presence and dependability "proclaims the gospel as effectively as any elaborate sermon."
