

Reflections



Transforming Congregational Culture by Anthony B. Robinson. Grand Rapids, Eerdmans Publishing, 2003. **Chapter 3:** *From Civic Faith to Human Transformation.*

In this chapter, Robinson explores the history of the church in an era he calls "civic faith." This is the time when the church was strong in America. The church's identity was that of the "conscience of the community." The church

stood was the moral compass of society. "A 'Christian' or 'a good Christian,' was a morally exemplary person rather than someone whose life was defined and shaped by a particular theological perspective." The church melded into the shape of secular society, often distorting the gospel from its message of grace into a kind of moralistic and legalistic conscience of the community.

The Civic Era promoted the church as the "primary instrument of aid and assistance to the least fortunate in the society." The church became the "givers" and "the other" were the receivers—a bit contrary to the gospel that considers ALL of us to be givers and receivers.

Thirdly, the Civic Era church was the center for community and family life. Church was the place to gather for all kinds of festivals, holidays, and special occasions.

Now, however, society has changed and is more secular, pluralistic, and postmodern. No longer is the church the center of our multicultural society. We are part of many centers where people live amid multiple loyalties.

The church's purpose has changed. Today's church is taking on the renewed purpose of helping people, with God's direction, make a change in their lives. The gospel story is a guide ". . . of grace and response," becoming "the lens, the perspective through which [we] can see and understand all of life."

People are longing "for depth, for meaning, for worship and spiritual practices that put a person in touch with the sacred, and for forms of engagement with others that are real and honest."

In this postmodern world, "The church is a fellowship, a gathering of those who are in the process of being changed, of those who are being saved and made new, and who invite others to join them in this adventure and in this life." We are a transformed people whose lives have been changed through Jesus Christ ". . . in light of God's grace—revealed in the Exodus, the Incarnation, and the Resurrection.

This is food for thought as we continue through the journey of Advent and prepare for Christ's birth and on into the coming year. What spiritual change are you experiencing in your life? Does the church continue to help you find purpose and meaning in your experience?

Voices of the people you have helped this month-"Yes, this is the first time we have been here. The Salvation Army sent us over." "Thank you for your help."








Do You Still Have One In The Back Of The Closet?

Spotlight on Disciples

Disciples in Canada

The Stone-Campbell movement in Canada had followers as early as the 1830's. Growth was slow in this large, sparsely populated country due to a variety of factors including loyalty to older institutions such as Roman Catholic. The beginnings of Disciples congregations in the Maritimes (Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and Prince Edward Island) were Scotch Baptist. Ministers who were advocates of *The Christian Baptist* brought Campbell's teachings northward. Ministers and congregations on Prince Edward Island greatly influenced the Disciples movement in Canada over the years. As the country expanded to the west, Disciples took their message of unity all the way to the coast. The first annual convention in Alberta was held at Calgary in July 1909 where the Alberta Christian Missionary Society was formed. Canadian Disciples established opportunities for study and education through higher education, journals, and papers. Canadian congregations, although sparse throughout Canada, were strong in mission and were great contributors of missionaries.
