Reflections

Our Church Board has agreed to read and discuss Robert Schnase's Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations (2018) over the course of the next few months. The following highlights some of the ideas presented in Chapter 2, "Radical Hospitality."

As I read Schnase's chapter on Radical Hospitality and contemplate and pray about hospitality in the context of our congregation, some basic questions come to mind. What opportunities do we offer people to spiritually connect with each other on a regular basis? Schnase suggests our connections with Bible studies, a Dinner Church (different from a church dinner), a Christian support group, a prayer ministry, a praise team, a service project and serving in a food bank. What are our spiritual growth opportunities in our congregation? (p.28) Are there opportunities in the week where people can come regularly to find God? We have a few. Can you name them? Are you involved in one?

Schnase suggests, "By such ministries, the Spirit fills the empty spaces in our lives, and God's initiating grace calls us out of ourselves and into the world of Christ's service. The power of a conversation or an invitation to change a person's life must never be underestimated! Perhaps that is how God changed each one of us!" (p.28)

Change often happens slowly. For instance, I just joined the gym after a long time of a lack of exercise. First, I'm noticing my stubbornness to change my routine and schedule to make time to go to the gym. Second, I'm finding how easy it is to talk myself out of going, even though I know from life experience, that if I indeed go on a regular basis, I will see and find a change in how I look and feel. I also know, that with the practice of making myself exercise even when I don't want to, I will, somewhere down the road, start wanting to go because my body longs for the exercise. Right now, it's rather a sluggish and painful time. I've chosen to have a personal trainer. This was a good choice, because she causes me to be accountable. Because I have to set an appointment to see her, I at least get to the gym for that appointment. In time, I know that I'll start to feel fit again and able to do way more than what seems possible right now.

So it is with our hospitality at church. In order to invite others to an opportunity to search for God in their lives, we need to be willing to put in the time and effort with something that helps us grow, for example, a weekly Bible study. We may need to change our routine to make time for it in our schedule. We may need to resist talking ourselves out of going. And then we need to actually attend. We may be inconsistent at first or we may be sluggish in getting ourselves to it. At first, we might need the others in our group to call us and help us attend—someone to be accountable to. But we know, in time, we will feel ourselves asking more searching questions because God made us to be spiritual creatures who long to be close to God and we will want to show up. And then, we will want to invite someone to something that is helping us—perhaps it will help them too!

That's radical caring. That's radical welcoming. That's radical hospitality!

In February we helped 58 families, consisting of 139 people with 58 bags of food plus 9 dozen eggs and various miscellaneous donated items.




Of those families, 23 were new to us.



Religions say their story is the right story. Spirituality sees the truth in all of them despite their unique differences.



Spotlight on Disciples

The Jazz Age and the Ku Klux Klan

Not all of history is illustrious and much of the 1920's brought about great uneasiness in the history of the nation and in the Disciples. More people had cars which brought about more travel and radio brought instant communication into homes. It was the age of the "flapper" and the "speak-easy." It was a time of relaxation—a kind of liberation. The former morality was being challenged. At the same time, another morality was also being challenged by the onset of organization ready to flame their way into the lives of ordinary folks—namely the Ku Klux Klan. Disciple clergy were threatened if they opposed the Klan. Congregations were split as the power of the group took on more and more supporters through the early 1920s. The KKK was just one of the internal conflicts that split Disciples into "liberals" and "conservatives."
