Reflections

Our Lenten series, "The Way," has taken us down the Camino de Santiago together. The movie, "The Way," has served as a metaphor for our journey with Jesus to Jerusalem. The story of Tom, who grieves his son, Daniel, who died while walking the Camino, created a backdrop of our own lives. His encounters with visions of Daniel throughout his journey are affirmations of his progress in growing and changing his mindset of what living is all about. His treatment of his fellow travelers embody that change.

The season of Lent is all about <u>our</u> spiritual journeys. The season is all about the inward look into the heart. It is a time to concentrate on our spiritual formation.

In his book, *Spiritual Formation*, Henri Nouwen writes that spiritual formation is "about the *movements* from the mind to the heart through prayer in its many forms that reunite us with God, each other, and our truest selves" (Kindle, location 140). However, these *movements* are not limited to our personal experience. We need each other along the way. When left to our own thoughts, it is easy for our hearts to remain ignorant. Nouwen reminds us, "When our heart knows only evil or selfish thoughts it will evoke evil and selfishness, but when our heart is formed by the living word of God in Christ it will discern the face of God in all it sees" (Kindle, location 173). As Christians, we are on this spiritual journey together, praying for each other, teaching each other, and caring for each other.

And so, we continue with Jesus toward Good Friday. But we need not despair. As we build our relationship with God through prayer and meditation, we know the darkness will soon turn to light and we will continue to form our spiritual connection more deeply.

With day break comes the morning light and Jesus comes forth from his tomb alive! His resurrection is only the beginning of our new life in Christ. Like the buds on the springtime trees, we too, will be renewed once again on this journey. May our days ahead be filled with wonder at the mysteries of God who brings hope from despair, gladness from sorrow, and life from death.

"I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wildness and rivers in the desert" (Isaiah 43:19).





Have you lost someone close and are going through the grief process?





How do I find my church to give to in the GivePlus Mobile app?



Spotlight on Disciples

The Great Depression and Recovery

The Great Depression impacted Disciples ministries greatly. Attendance and offerings were down, mortgages went unpaid were sometimes foreclosed. Ministers worked at reduced salaries or ministers became unemployed. The United Christian Missionary Society (UCMS) was hit particularly hard and reductions included cuts in staff and the withdrawal of missionaries worldwide. It wasn't until 1936 that the income showed a gain over the previous year and the ministry budget was back in the black. After the Depression, social reform was on the rise and an interest in the social gospel was apparent. The institutional life of the Disciples was profoundly affected. All of the institutions and agencies of the church were damaged including institutions of higher learning which emerged with heavy loads of debt. Agencies such as the UCMS needed reorganization and new agencies were created.
