Reflections

On Wisdom and Teaching

Proverbs 8:1, 9-11

Does not wisdom call,

Main, Fort Scott, KS 66701 continues to handle the memorial to the Xenia Masonic Lodge #47 AF & AM. The oldest lodge west of the Mississippi continues to do work in the tiny building in which it was chartered in 1867. My parents, Ernest & Grace Hyatt were members of the Masonic Organizations for over 65 years.

The Sister City Story research continues at the Lyon County History Center. Preston Plumb of Xenia, OH came to Kansas, founded Emporia in 1857. My ancestors followed in 1858 and founded Xenia, Kansas. Many, many families came from Ohio at the urging of a 20 year old, Preston Plumb. Each day our history fades away. If you have any stories of your family from Ohio or here, please contact LCHC. Preston, the two Xenias have many connections in the past and in the present day. The research will benefit thousands of families in Kansas all the way to Ohio. Saturday, June 8 will be the 45th anniversary of our awful tornado. Xenia, OH also lost 33 people in April 1974. 

Disciples and World War II (part 1)

As World War II affected every person and family in the United States, so it affected the Disciples church. As millions of young Americans were drafted, the church felt the effects of their absences. There was a deep sense of Christian responsibility for the church to participate in the war effort.

Missionaries and their families in foreign lands were the first to suffer internment. Sixteen men and women and three children were held in various countries for various amounts of time. "Ultimately all Disciples missionaries trapped by the war were released or repatriated."

Nearly 400 Disciples ministers wishing to serve as military chaplains went through the Chaplaincy Endorsement Commission of the International Convention of Disciples of Christ. Through a Disciples Committee on War Services, emergency funds for program development, financial aid for displaced persons, and other funds to assist interned Japanese-American Disciples provided hope for individuals and families throughout the war.
