What's it like to be on the outside? People who live on the margins of society are often cast aside simply by the built-in structures formed to protect. Life on the outside of the "in" crowd can make it difficult to fit in, to feel "at home." The Gospel of Luke chronicles Jesus' ministry with those on the so -called "outside." What can we learn from these stories and Jesus' call to turn the inside out and the outside in?





## **Disciples Historical Society**

Suggestions for the preservation of Disciples historical materials were made in the late 1800's. In 1901, Errett Gates proposed a historical society, but it would be nearly forty years before a committee would form in 1939 to work on the idea. The 1941 St. Louis convention approved the constitution for the Disciples of Christ Historical Society. "Its purpose was to stimulate interest in the collection, preservation, and use of various materials relating to the Stone-Campbell movement." Its temporary location was at Culver-Stockton College, Canton, Missouri with Claude E. Spencer, the librarian of the college, elected as curator. Through the years, the collection has continued to grow. It was decided that the collection would be moved in 1951 to the Thomas W. Phillips Memorial building in the Joint University Libraries (sponsored by Peabody College, Scarrit College, and Vanderbilt University) in Nashville, Tennessee.

It remained there until a recent move to a location adjacent to Alexander Campbell's study and mansion near Bethany College, founded by Campbell in 1840. Historical books, journals; files of congregations, ministries, and worldwide missions; artifacts; and memorabilia are archived. (www.bethanywv.edu.)
