Reflections

The Church Board continues in its study of Robert Schnase's Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations (2018). Chapter 3, "The Practice of Passionate Worship," is important for everyone in the congregation because worship is so personal. Yet, as Christians, worship is meant to be communal. We are to worship together "for the love of God." The next few Reflections will be dedicated to exploring Schnase's material. I hope that you will take these ideas to heart and pray for God's guidance as we continue to experiment with a variety of worship models. We need every voice in creating meaningful worship experiences and I invite you to share your voice along with those on our church board.

You can share ideas with your Worship Ministry Team: Barb Gimple (Chair), Janece Bacon, Lorraine Bailey (ex-officio), Martín Cuellar, Karen Garnett, and Cameron Moore.

Robert Schnase explains that "Passionate Worship connects people to God, to one another, and to the world around them. People gather consciously as the body of Christ with eagerness and expectancy; encounter Christ through singing, prayer, scripture, and Holy Communion; and respond by allowing God's Spirit to shape their lives" (p. 50). What parts of the worship service connect you to God? When do you feel most in tune with the Holy Spirit? Schnase also describes how God "uses worship to transform lives, heal wounded souls, renew hope, shape decisions, provoke change, inspire compassion, bind people to one another, and prepare them to serve their neighbor" (p. 50) Have you ever come to worship with a decision on your mind and left feeling that God had revealed something new to you?

We are spiritual beings created to worship God. It is in our core fabric that we spend time with God in worship with others. The Holy Spirit taps into our souls as we praise and worship our Creator. God renews and restores us to go out and be God's ambassadors of God's grace. It is in the worship experience that we can fully connect our spirits with God's.

Blessings to all of us as we ponder our experiences of worship as they relate to our brothers and sisters in the community of Christ.





Spotlight on Disciples

Disciples and World War II (part 2)

During the third and fourth years of the war, Disciples were hopeful for postwar enduring peace. Discussions brought out ideas of a reconstructed world to prevent future wars. Drake University hosted a conference entitled, "The Church and the New World Mind," in 1944. The conference inspired revived Bible study in homes, churches, church schools, women's societies, and youth groups. The recurring theme, "You Are What You Read," encouraged many churches to establish church libraries and to purchase books to fill them.

After the war ended in 1945, Disciples supported the formation of the United Nations. With the recovery from the "Great Depression," Disciples picked up delayed building projects and strengthened weakened programs. The future main concern was the denominational structure that would develop over the next decades.
