

get started. They have some wonderful ideas and will bring a new excitement to the choir. First practice is this Thursday, August 15 at 6:00 p.m. COME JOIN US!


DISCIPLES CONNECT AND EQUIP

Unification Leads to Restructure

After WWII, it was found that old structures and systems were inadequate in serving the new challenges facing the church. "A Crusade for a Christian World" revealed the need for more intensive program coordination. The "Committee on Brotherhood Organization and Interagency Relationships" met for the first time in 1957. At the meeting, "it became clear that the structure of the International Convention must reflect more fully an inclusive and unified church program and organization." Unification was needed. Following a "Conference on Unification" in 1958, guidelines were established for many programs, societies, and organizations to unify. Also in 1958, a series of "Listening Conferences" revealed intense interest in additional program and structural coordination. As a result, the Council of Agencies recommended, and the convention approved a "Study Committee on Brotherhood Structure" that met three times during 1959-1960. The study findings led to the national Convention adoption of plans for a new form of organization to be known as "restructure." The next decade would be dedicated to moving forward through listening conferences, consultations, institutes, and lectures in seminaries. The life of the Christian Churches (Disciples of Christ) was preparing for a major shift.
