Reflections

As the summer comes to a close and we enter the time of year when children go back to school, and we begin to think about cooler weather, we will soon embark on a journey with the prophet Jeremiah. Just as God, like a potter, reshapes creation and turns leaves to gold, God reshapes and re-forms us.

Jeremiah lived during the time when Israel forgot God's goodness and rejected God. They broke their covenant and failed to follow God's instructions. It was a time when God, like a parent, had to discipline God's children. Jerusalem would be destroyed and Israel would be exiled to Babylonia in 587 B.C. Yet God is gracious and merciful. In due time, God would reshape and remake and restore Jerusalem and the Temple. God will pluck up and pull down that which defiled, but then build and plant to make all things new.

God, who held the peoples and nations accountable, also experienced their pain and disappointment. So it is today. God remembered them and remembers us. When Israel and Judah are punished, God weeps after them (Jer. 8:22; 9:10, 17-18; 14:17). God was "deeply moved" (Jer. 31:20) for the ancient peoples and God is deeply moved for us. Through it all, God is a God of "do-overs" and healing comes.

The image of God as the potter who works and reworks the clay gives us a glimpse into God's promises. God knows the true nature of God's people. Even though God gets frustrated when we break covenant, fail to follow God's instructions, and turn away from the ways of God, God remembers the beauty of creation. God is faithful and continues to remake and mold us out of God's love, calling us to pick up the broken pieces of our lives and to find healing amid the tears.

Join us each Sunday in worship as we discover God's unending love for the people of Jeremiah's time and for us in this series, *Prophecies and Pottery: Journey with Jeremiah*. Get into the book of Jeremiah and prepare for each Sunday by prereading the scriptures for each week:

August 25: Jeremiah 1:4-10 September 1: Jeremiah 2:4-13 September 8: Jeremiah 18:1-11 September 15: Jeremiah 4:11-12, 22-28 September 22: Jeremiah 8:18-9:1

September 29: Jeremiah 32:1-3a, 6-15

get started. They have some wonderful ideas and will bring a new excitement to the choir. There is still time to join, so give it a try, you night like it!


Collect for WAW School




If there is interest in attending the one day retreat, please let us know so that we may make car pool arrangements.



Ecumenical Developments

From the early days, Christian unity has always been important to Disciples. As ecumenical programs gathered around the world, Disciples took interest and sent some of its outstanding executives to serve on councils. Disciples were represented at many early ecumenical gatherings including the World Conference (Edinburgh, 1910), a planning conference on Faith and Order (Geneva, Switzerland, 1920 and Lausanne, 1927, Edinburgh, 1937), the Universal Christian Council for Life and Work (Stockholm, 1925 and Oxford, 1937). Disciples were present at a meeting in Utrecht, Netherlands, 1938 to draft a constitution for a World Council of Churches and participated on the committee of 34 to organize the Council. Young people represented the Disciples at the new World Conference of Christian Youth at Oslo, Norway, for the summer of 1947. Disciples elected eight delegates plus sent Disciple visitors to the first World Council of Churches Assembly held in Amsterdam (September, 1948). One hundred forty church bodies in forty countries were represented at this gathering.

Back home, Disciples took great interest in participating in the formation of the National Council of Churches. In the fall of 1950, Disciple delegates joined 28 other Protestant and Eastern Orthodox churches in a ceremony in Cleveland, Ohio to declare their solidarity in Christian faith. Through the years, Disciples have continued their support of the National Council of Churches and many Disciples have served on important committees and in various capacities on staffs of ecumenical organizations at home and abroad.
