#### Reflections

As we continue to look at Chapter 4, "The Practice of Intentional Faith Development" (pp. 83-85), in *Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations* (2018), Robert Schnase describes why it is important to be intentional in our faith development.

Schnase explains that "Intentional refers to deliberate effort, purposeful action toward an end, and high prioritization. It highlights the significance of faith development and contrasts those faith communities that take it seriously with those that offer it haphazardly and inconsistently, without new initiative, plan, or purpose."

Intentional Faith Development describes certain ministries as vital to their mission:

Christian education small-group work faith-forming relationships Bible study

Congregations who are committed to these ministries consistently offer

- •opportunities for people of all ages, interests, and faith experiences to learn in community.
- •opportunities for people to engage in faith development at the church (Come and See)
- •opportunities for people who may never enter the church or become part of the congregation (Go and Do).

These congregations consciously and deliberately cover the whole age spectrum, fostering faith development outside of worship during the course of the year for

Children couples
Youth middle-aged adults
young adults and older adults
Singles

### Intentional congregations

- study and analyze demographic makeup of people in their community
- note people's shared interests, anxieties, and lifestyles
- create ways to meet people wherever they are, spiritually and in everyday life
- develop opportunities for study, discussion, and growth with and for people outside the congregation
- examine efforts to offer radical hospitality and passionate worship in the wider community
- create all sorts of small communities for fellowship and study
- host topical discussion nights at the church or a location in the community
- hold ask-a-pastor events with open discussion
- host or take part in multidenominational community classes where new residents can learn about Christianity

Most importantly, Schnase stresses that "Churches that practice Intentional Faith Development know the secret of small groups."

Are we willing to explore and experiment with small groups? God is calling our congregation to step out of our comfort zone and to grow in the Holy Spirit in new ways. Are you willing to participate in a small group Bible Study or even be a leader? Please keep our church and your own gifts in prayer.

## **Toward a Restructured Church (part 1)**

The 1960's was a time of crisis in faith in our nation. Disciples were undergoing a growing social consciousness. The nation was grappling with the unpopular Vietnam war and other "civil rights" issues. As mainline churches were experiencing decline, "A Plan of Union" was composed that included a consortium of nine denominations including Disciples. Within our "brotherhood," a Commission on Restructure consisting of "representatives nominated by each state, province, and area board, eight state and are executives, the members of a central committee, six chief executives of national agencies not included on the central committee, ten college and seminary faculty members, the editor of *The Christian*, the editor of *World Call*, and thirtynine to forty-nine persons to be nominated at large. The attempt was to be made to secure a commission as representative of all the churches as possible. A central committee, consisting of fifteen to eighteen persons, was to be appointed from the membership of the commission to give direction." With the commission in place, the arduous work of restructure began.
