Reflections

In all of its beauty, Christmas is an odd time of year. At no other time do we pull out the old memories and decorate our houses with such strange customs as bringing living trees into our homes. At no other time do we make the most effort to see family and friends. We watch old Christmas movies and reminisce about Christmases gone by. Schools take their winter breaks and companies give extra time off. The downtown streets and houses around town don their Christmas dressings. Bell ringers and Santa Clauses are at all the stores. Christmas is, indeed, an odd time of year!

Still more strangely, are the customs surrounding the birth of the Christ Child. At no other time do Christians come together to celebrate God quite the way we do at Christmas. We decorate our churches and sing Christmas Carols. We gather at special fellowship meals and Advent workshops. Carolers take time to go together to see shut-ins and sing. Implementing the Provisional Design

Upon its adoption at the Kansas City Assembly in 1968, the Provisional Design made provision for interim work to begin within the new structures that were set forth. Committees were set to examine every facet of governance. The new name stood for a new interrelatedness in the various manifestations of the church. Former agencies of the International Convention became divisions, councils, administrative units of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). Later, other agencies restructured themselves to become responsible units of the Church. Through the years, most of these have survived (some have updated their names), others were dissolved and new units have been added to keep us moving into the future.
