Reflections

Over the past two and a half years or so, I have been summarizing the history of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) from Lester G. McAllister and William E. Tucker's book, *Journey in Faith*. These summaries appear in "Spotlight on Disciples" in our church newsletter every two weeks. This has been a disciplined task for me and has helped me (and hopefully you) to be more acquainted with our church history. In today's edition, false fear resulted in the exiting of many congregations as work on a new constitution proposed change in the structure of the denomination.

Some were opposed to making the changes. Someone thought that these changes would cause harm to individual congregations. They didn't understand the complexities and circulated their misunderstandings among the people. Fear happens with change. We humans want to be comfortable and have things continue in the same manner of which we are accustomed. Change is difficult especially when false information is disseminated. Faith becomes challenged. Hope can seem far away.

If change is to occur, faith must be a partner. Faith, however, isn't easy because faith, according to theologian Jurgen Moltmann, is itself a contradiction. Moltmann, wrote in his book, Theology of Hope (1967), "...faith, wherever it develops into hope, causes not rest but unrest, not patience but impatience. It does not calm the unquiet heart, but is itself this unquiet heart in [the self]. Those who hope in Christ can no longer put up with reality as it is, but begin to suffer under it, to contradict it" (21).

Moltmann tells us that the faith that we hold is actually the underlying cause of conflict within us. Because of faith, we are at conflict with the world, but we are left with hope. Hope also leaves the Church in constant disturbance with society as we seek justice and freedom.

So it is, at this time of year, we ask God to strengthen our faith and our hope as we seek the baby in the manger. The One who is lying there is the Hope we need. He is the Hope we are looking for to bring a change in our ways of doing things in our personal lives and in our church. He is the One who will give us courage and faith to endure any fear or doubts we have in bringing about a newness of life in our congregation.

In hope, we must learn the lessons of history. The great change in our church history was in the restructure of our denomination's ways of thinking about how the mission of Jesus Christ should be carried out. We must not lose hope as we grapple with our own fears.

Let us awaken to all that God is calling us to do in this coming year. We will have **many** sacrifices to make in order to move forward into this new decade. May the hope of the coming birth of the Christ child take us to new understanding of God's mission so that we may become true witnesses of the "future of Jesus Christ." Shalom,

The church will be hosting a Home Business/Craft Expo on December 7th from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm in Fellowship Hall.


Booth spaces are 15 x 15 and rent for \$20.00. Tables and chairs will be furnished.

Opposition to Restructure and the Provisional Design

As with any change, there were those who opposed the work of the Commission on Restructure. Change is difficult and the unknown is often frightening. It is usually out of fear that opposition arises and so it was with this fundamental change in direction of the Disciples. One such resistance was an anonymous Committee for the Preservation of the Brotherhood appeared with concerns that individual congregations would lose their property rights with the adoption of the new Provisional Design. Two pamphlets entitled, "Freedom or Restructure?" and "The Truth About Restructure" were widely distributed causing a great upheaval in the brotherhood, ultimately still a concern after the Provisional Design was passed resulting in more than 2,300 congregations removing themselves from *Year Book* in 1968 leaving 4,046 participating congregations by 1970. This was a formal acknowledgement of a division that had been in process since 1927. The work of implementing the provisional design had begun.
