Reflections

Lately, I've been reading a Diana Butler-Bass book entitled, The People's History of Christianity. In her book, Butler-Bass differentiates

types of Christianity experienced throughout Christian history.

The first type is what she labels "Big-C" Christianity—Christ, Constantine, Christendom, Calvin, and Christian America. This type, throughout history, used militant strategies to win over paganism all in the name of Christianity. The author names the second type Great Command Christianity based on Luke 10:25-27. She explains, "the history of Christian people who embrace the Great Command and follow Jesus's instruction to go and do likewise'... Great Command Christianity invites us to participate in a living tradition, to reconsider faith as a community of people who practice God's love and mercy through time." Sound familiar? It should. Hopefully, you would agree that "Great Command Christianity" is the theology we embrace in our congregation.

Butler-Bass also discusses the unexpected renewal of moderate and liberal Christianity in North America. This group of Christians call themselves "progressive" or "emerging" Christians. What I am most intrigued with is a term Butler-Bass uses that she claims goes beyond the existing categories of "conservative-moderate-liberal." Her term "generative Christianity," describes congregations and individuals who "have stumbled into meaningful spiritual practices and a renewed sense of social justice without knowing, perhaps, that these new discoveries have long histories in the Christian tradition." Basically, we need to know our history in order to move forward. Our task is to find meaningful ways to do this.

In our congregational and personal quests for renewal and transformation, it could be that the term "generative Christianity" will fit us. Adopting the term can help us find our own identity—who we were, who we are, and who we are becoming.

We have been diligently exploring important elements such as the practices of spiritual disciplines, spiritual gifts, hospitality, worship, and intentional faith development to help open us to God's future for us. It's an exciting time and one that we never should take lightly. Our walk with God is a life-long journey of faith. We are in it for the long-term—always seeking to learn, to grow, and to serve.



The season of Lent begins February 26 with Ash Wednesday. Lent is the forty days, excluding Sundays, before Easter. It is the season that Christians prepare themselves spiritually for the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ.
