Reflections

As we move through Robert Schnase's book, Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations (2018), we discover how the practices intertwine. Over the last year, we have taken glimpses of "Radical Hospitality," "Passionate Worship," and "Intentional Faith Development." Each of them needs elements from the other in order for us to become a vital, nurturing congregation. And now, Schnase introduces in chapter 5, "The Practice of Risk-Taking Mission and Service" (pp. 101-127). This is where the nurture of hospitality, the genuineness in our worship, and our faithful study of scripture meets Christ's commission. All of it comes together as we continue to grow in Christ.

In his discussion about mission and service, Schnase tells about a couple who, because of their pursuance of a deeper spiritual life, nourished through worship and faith development at their local church, wondered, "Where do the homeless people in our community go each day? Who are they? How do they live, and where do they find shelter?" The couple found small camps of people under a bridge and behind abandoned buildings. In encountering them, they found out what necessities they needed and brought to them. They met with them every Saturday and began to form relationships and eventually began taking worship to the people. All of this led to a surprise one day when the people under the bridge cleaned up the area and began to offer hospitality. This eventually led to the church adding space for showers, laundry, food, and clothing.

It used to be that hospitality, worship, study, and missions were all separate entities of the church. We are beginning to see at First Christian Church that this is no longer true. We are finding these units bumping into one another. We realized, this last year, that evangelism can no longer be its own committee. We find evangelism in every aspect of the church and so now we ask that each committee make evangelism part of their agendas. The same can be true of each of the above four areas. Sure, we need individual teams to help orchestrate worship, Christian education, and outreach, but they do not have to work separately. We need to see teams working across the board, collaborating and helping each other discover how each area blends with the other.

As the Holy Spirit guides our steps toward radical risk-taking in all areas of our ministry, may we, like the couple in Robert Schnase's story, search for a deeper spiritual life and continue to find that we "bump into each other" and tap into one another's gifts and work together toward radical mission and service.


## **Stewardship Pledge Drive**



#### **Spotlight on Disciples**

In this "Spotlight," I have decided to use a section out of Duane Cummins' book (2017), A Handbook for Today's Disciples in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), entitled, "Since 1968: A Church in Covenant." Cummins gives a thumbnail sketch of the more recent developments in our Disciples history. As with the culture experiencing a change in loyalties to institutions, Disciples found "severe financial constraint due to declining membership coupled with weakness in stewardship and a near dysfunctional system of financial distribution." During this time, Disciples closed one university, saw one bankruptcy, one misappropriation of funds, two mismanagements of regional resources, and the discontinuance of a major periodical. Membership declined between 1968 (over 1 million) and 2016 (274,000). It was "a time of growing religious pluralism, an environment marked by a new-age, post-modern search for individual spirituality, an age of disaffection from mainline Protestant institutional religion (Methodist, Presbyterian, American Baptist, United Church of Christ, Episcopal, Lutheran, and Disciples)." Through it all, Disciples remained driven.
