## Reflections

#### We've Never Done It This Way Before

There's no doubt that in churches everywhere, during the midst of making change, chime out with heart and soul, "We've never done it this way before." How many times have every one of us either thought it or actually said it out loud when that pesky minister has asked us to make a change?

And then, there's the debate. How can we possibly do what is being asked of us? If it is a change that rubs us a little rough, there will be meetings of concerned people and then possibly town hall meetings of the congregation, and finally, board meetings where a decision can be made whether or not to move forward with the change. Ah, that's church life!

Change is difficult for everyone. Human beings usually do not like change. Change often rubs us the wrong way and we grumble and complain until we kind of get used to the idea after a while. And then here it comes. . . it just seems to pop out when we least expect it. . . that old adage, "We've never done it like this before!"

Currently, we all know that the coronavirus has put us in a state of change like no other... "We've never done it this way before!" Multiple problems with the recording have left the videographers scratching their heads while attempting to solve the most recent dilemma. Everything is new and while we are silently screaming under our masks, "We've never done it this way before!" we take things in stride and continue on.

Change is always difficult, but we are living proof that we CAN handle it. Sure, "we've never done it this way before," but there are some adaptive processes that are beginning to take shape. New beginnings for all of us—at home, at work, at church. God will continue to bless us as we reinvent how we do things to adapt to our current situation. WE CAN DO IT!

So, let us thank God for all God is doing in the midst of the chaos. Let us continue to be cautious and safe. Most of all, let us be loving and kind and forgiving as we travel together through this uncertain time. And may God give us patience that while "we've never done it this way before," we do new things with a heart full of grace.

## 2020 Regional Assembly Canceled



The following is excerpted from the original letter found in the June Kansas Messenger.

Due to the persistence of the COVID-19 pandemic, the 2020 Regional Assembly at Tawakoni, originally scheduled for August 8, has been canceled.

There are several regional business issues that require a vote by the region. The region has developed an alternative to the typical Regional Assembly voice vote with a mail-in voting method.

[The board of First Christian Church, Emporia, will elect at our July 15<sup>th</sup> meeting, two] Certified delegates [along with Pastor Lorraine, who] will vote on several items including the slate of regional officers, 2021 General Assembly voting representatives, a revised Regional Policy on Misconduct, and the "Time" and Place" recommendation for the 2022 Regional Assembly.

To help educate voters, two opportunities are available to discuss by Zoom video conference: Tuesday, July 14, or Thursday, July 23. Both calls are scheduled for 7 p.m. CDT. Computer log-in and phone dial-in information is available in each church's information packet. Zoom discussion meetings will be recorded and made available upon request.

Votes are due to the CCK office in Topeka by end-of-business, August 6. Results will be available in the August Kansas Messenger and on our website.



#### Covenant: Freedom with Accountability (part 4)

The reorganization of the church in the 1960's, called Restructure, revised the meaning of liberty as responsible freedom. As a result of the new church structure, all three manifestations or expressions of the church (Congregational, Regional, and General) are set in covenantal interdependence. This means for example that "The General Assembly. . . cannot dictate to the congregations, but neither are congregations free to ignore the corporate decision-making of the church in assembly." The decision making goes to the majority who are made up of steadfast Christians.

Most importantly, covenant keeps us accountable to God and to each other by putting persons in place to help us to do so. The church exists to not only meet our needs, but to shape us to live in a Christ-like way, different from the world around us. The church challenges our presuppositions and calls us "to intimate life with persons we, humanly speaking, may not like or like." In short, when we are in covenant, we become self-accountable to our promises.
