Reflections

Recently, the focus of the *Spotlight on Disciples* article (in our church newsletter) has been on Michael Kinnamon and Jan Linn's book, *Disciples: Who We Are and What Holds Us Together*. In chapter 2, the authors discuss the meaning of covenant.

Covenant is described as "a key term in scripture." The authors remind us that covenant is more than an agreement with humans. It is "a commitment to mutual accountability that presupposes a community intent on the study of scripture, intent on living a life centered on God, intent on recognizing God's grace in the other." It "emphasizes responsibilities as well as rights and is based on 'because/ therefore' thinking . . ." Finally, "[c]ovenant involves limitations, but they are limitations that lead to the real freedom of living no longer for ourselves (pp. 13-15).

It is suggested that Disciples have lost the sense of covenant in our churches, yet *The Design* (our constitution) incorporates the following covenantal language:

[T]his church expresses itself in covenantal relationships in congregations, regions, and general ministries of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), bound by God's covenant of love. Each expression is characterized by its integrity, self-governance, authority, rights, and responsibilities, yet they relate to each other in a covenantal manner, to the end that all expressions will seek God's will and be faithful to God's mission. We are committed to mutual accountability (p. 18).

What does this mean? Most importantly, we are bound together by God's love and that we seek to understand who God is and how we can live out our understanding through faithful accountability to God, each other, and our commitment to following Christ.

When we become members of the church, we covenant with God and the other members of the congregation that we will become active in worship, study, community life, and service or mission. We promise that we will give a portion of our God-given time, talent, and resources back to God and for Christ's mission in thankful praise for all that God has given to us.

Are the authors correct? Have we lost this sense of covenant among our people? How can we renew and restore this beautiful part of being a Christian and belonging to a Christian family? How can we renew our baptismal vows and rediscover our covenantal responsibilities?

God bless all of us who share life and ministry together as we seek God's will and may our lives be a blessing to others.

Spotlight on Disciples

Covenant: Freedom with Accountability (part 5)

In the continued topic of covenant, Kinnamon and Linn highlight Robert Bellah's conclusion in *Habits of the Heart*, "that most Americans no longer get moral instructions from character-forming communities of any kind, including the church." While we Disciples "believe in the freedom of every Christian to make [their] own decisions in matters of faith," we choose to freedom over covenantal responsibility. Clark Williamson, professor of theology at Christian Theological Seminary believes that our stance on this freedom places opinion over understanding. Basically, we have let the importance of covenant slip out from under us and have forgotten our understanding of covenant with God which includes not only ourselves, but each other. We discount our need for communal Christian Education and therefore we assert our opinions without having spent time grappling with deeper matters of faith. The authors recommend that congregations begin an intentional, ongoing conversation about covenant and suggest ways to bring individual and communal covenant back into the life of the congregation.
