

Reflections

Hymns are powerful faith builders for Christians. Through the ages, congregations continue to sing the songs of faith in good times, in times of peril, and in times that challenge us to the core. As part of a three-part series, today's hymn, "Lift Every Voice and Sing," rings with hope today as when it was written.



James Weldon Johnsonⁱ (June 17, 1871 – June 26, 1938) studied literature at Atlanta University (graduated 1894, MA 1904), and went on to become a song writer, anthologist, teacher, and lawyer.

Another side of James was his talent at songwriting. He and his composer brother, John, wrote songs for musical theater on Broadway.

By the time he was 30 years old, he became the first African-American to pass the bar in the state of Florida and the author of the lyrics of "Lift Ev'ry Voice and Sing" to honor Booker T. Washington as part of an elementary school tribute to Abraham Lincoln's birthday. The song became known as the "Negro National Anthem," promoted by the NAACP.

1) Lift ev'ry voice and sing, Till earth and heaven ring, Ring with the harmonies of liberty; Let our rejoicing rise High as the list'ning skies, Let it resound loud as the rolling sea. Sing a song full of the faith that the dark past has taught us; Sing a song full of the hope that the present has brought us; Facing the rising sun Of our new day begun, Let us march on till victory is won.

2) Stony the road we trod, Bitter the chast'ning rod, Felt in the days when hope unborn had died; Yet with a steady beat, Have not our weary feet Come to the place for which our people sighed? We have come over a way


Audio/Video Equipment Update:

Spotlight on Disciples

Information for this article came from the book, *Disciples: Who We Are & What Holds Us Together* (2019) by Michael Kinnamon and Jan Linn, St. Louis: Christian Board of Publication, pp. 24-27.

Covenant: Freedom with Accountability (part 7)

In the final paragraphs of this chapter on "the freedom that is ours in Christ," Kinnamon and Linn want to make known some concerns that come along side of these freedoms. They remind us that a healthy church will allow "the 'three d's—*dialogue, diversity, and dissent.*" The authors warn us that right now there are some missing pieces in our covenant:

the absence of mutual accountability

the absence of authoritative teaching by the church (authorized curricula, Assembly-approved studies, etc.) the absence of structures and processes of mutual accountability

Kinnamon and Linn remind us that in our society today, there is a deep hunger for a faith that demands discipline that will guide us to make a difference in the way we live and our witness to society. "To demonstrate disciplined community that yet values diversity, dialogue, and dissent—to model responsible freedom—requires real spiritual maturity." The authors warn that without mutual accountability and authoritative teaching, we run the danger of becoming "clubs of culturally formed individuals" concerned with psychic distress relief and institutional maintenance. How does this affect our congregation?
