



Spotlight on Disciples

Information for this article came from the book, *Disciples: Who We Are & What Holds Us Together* (2019) by Michael Kinnamon and Jan Linn, St. Louis: Christian Board of Publication, pp. 30-34.

Kinnamon and Linn raise the awareness that there is a troubling silence of the Bible in church. It is not a new problem, but a prevalent one. Disciples' Biblical competence is falling silent mainly because of 2 factors: 1) the use of historical criticism in the study of the Bible has scared people away from study and 2) "Some of those who emphasize the Bible's authority sound as if there is only one way it can be interpreted—namely, theirs."

One of our founders, Alexander Campbell, left us with something rich—he gave us a genuinely critical spirit. His rules for study were grounded in a historical-critical approach to scripture, and "were intended to enhance its authority by enabling *all* church members to have a fresh hearing of the gospel." Campbell believed that all Christians could participate in study of the Bible—study was not reserved for clergy alone.

The authors reaffirm Disciples' stand on biblical authority. "At best, Disciples have known that the Bible is the book of the church, to be read and studied within the community of those who seek to stand 'within the understanding distance.' We have believed that the essential meaning of scripture, while we may disagree about parts of it, is not beyond our grasp, especially when guided by the best available biblical scholarship. We have felt no need to protect the Bible's authority from 'the most prying inquiry.' We have known that it does not lessen scripture's authority to acknowledge that it can become an idol if we venerate *it* instead of the God to whom it bears witness. And to receive that witness, we need to have knowledge of its contents."
