Reflections

Before COVID hit back in March, we were studying Robert Schnase's book, Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations (2018). His ideas for the section "Go and Do" (pp. 122-123) help us to think outside the box when considering "Risk-Taking Mission and Service."

In this section, Schnase reminds us that "Risk-taking witness is a tool God uses to change lives, communities, and nations." He invites us to consider how we can make space for others to join us in our mission to the community.

Schnase encourages churches that practice Risk-Taking Mission to:

- Make space for people who do not attend church to make a difference in the lives of others by inviting them to help.
- Use on-line meetings and studies to cut down the obstacle of distance.
- Shoot videos and photos to share on social media, at worship, and at other gatherings.
- Use digital platforms for project management and training.
- Continue annual and ongoing projects that truly make a difference.
- Become involved in bearing witness to wider social change with an eye for protecting the most vulnerable.
- Advocate for policies that improve the lives and conditions of those who struggle at the margins of society.
- Mobilize against racism, injustice, and abuse, and work and pray for peace.
- Stay informed about issues that affect people and encourage civic and political participation.

How exciting it is that we already embrace several of these ideas. We are on our way to increasing our commitment to God through service. In our current climate, we might ask ourselves questions of how we can become more involved in bringing hope and help to our community and beyond.

Spotlight on Disciples

Information for this article came from the book, *Disciples: Who We Are & What Holds Us Together* (2019) by Michael Kinnamon and Jan Linn, St. Louis: Christian Board of Publication, pp. 34-37

While Alexander Campbell, like others in his era, felt that after study, people of reason would come to a common understanding of the Bible, post modern Christians have come to realize how diverse the Bible is and that it is important to be read with diverse perspectives. Disciples, in covenant with each other, agree to stay at the table, read the Bible together through our diverse lenses, and seek understanding of it together. Kinnamon and Linn remind us that "Covenant and scripture are the foundation stones of our shared life." We look to "scripture for guidance, embrace one another in covenant because we all belong to Christ."

Kinnamon and Linn give five recommendations for the congregational practice of study together:

- 1. Hold on-line All Church Bible Studies a few times a year. Invite participants to read and reflect on selected texts and invite corporate discussion.
- 2. Train teachers to teach Bible study. Invite leaders to use resources such as *The New Interpreter's Bible One Volume Commentary* and to read books such as *Reading the New Testament for the First Time*, by Disciples scholar Ron Allen.
- 3. Ministers are urged to be teachers and trainers of teachers.
- 4. Use experience, reason, and tradition to dialogue with the Bible.
- 5. "Always set Bible study in the context of prayer . . . Prayer opens our spirits to God's as we seek to know and follow God's will, not just our own."
