Reflections



Something spectacular is happening this month! We will see the conjunction of two planets, Jupiter and Saturn. They will be the closest they have been together since 1623. They will appear in the southwest sky just above the horizon. We can already see them up there, not too far away from each other.

Today, both historians and theologians believe that Jesus was born sometime between 6 BC and 4 BC. At the time of its invention, the calendar meant to show the new era, Anno Domini (A.D.), to start with the date of Jesus' birth at 1 AD, but by the time the mistake was realized, the calendar was already set. Also, King Herod died in 4 BC. This is important as we look at the dates of the convergence of the planets that could be responsible for the appearance of the Star of Bethlehem.

Some people believe that it was the conjunction of planets that created the "Christmas Star" that the wisemen followed to find the baby Jesus. One possibility is that it could have been a nova occurring in 5BC or 4BC near the conjunction of planets causing a remarkable brightness. Another possibility is the near proximity of three planets, Mars, Jupiter, and Saturn that caused the great light in the sky around 6BC.

There are other possibilities. However, we will most likely never know the exact dates for Jesus' birth or the wisemen's visit.

What we do know is that a stunning astronomical phenomenon occurred that led the ancient astrologers to Bethlehem sometime after Jesus was born. Perhaps, as we gaze up on December 21st, we might wonder at the miracle of Jesus' birth as the wisemen did when they saw Emmanuel, "God with us," the One who came to save the world.

⁷Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. ⁸Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." ⁹When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. ¹¹On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. (Matthew 2:9-11)

Let us still seek Him during this season of hope and beyond with our whole hearts, minds, souls, and strength.

Spotlight on Disciples

Information for this article came from the book, *Disciples: Who We Are & What Holds Us Together* (2019) by Michael Kinnamon and Jan Linn, St. Louis: Christian Board of Publication, p. 45.

Alexander Campbell and Barton W. Stone differed somewhat in their approach to the Lord's Table. Both were rationalists. Campbell's dominant rational influence tended to leave the act of remembrance at just that, remembrance. Stone, on the other hand, while he was a rationalist, he also believed that the work of the Holy Spirt was "the Spirit of Christ himself working in a Christian's life." He had an appreciation for the mystical side of faith. While Campbell "thought" about being one in Christ around the Lord's Table, Stone felt that the experience was deepened through interaction with the Holy Spirit. "The Holy Spirit is in the end the power for creating oneness in the body of Christ." Stone believed,

It is the spirit of holiness, which, when received, hungers and thirsts for righteousness, pants for God and a perfect conformity to his lovely character. It is the spirit of adoption, whereby we cry Abba, Father. It is the spirit of love to God, and man. It is the spirit which unites the whole family of God. It is the spirit of power, by which we re enabled to oppose successful every temptation, and every enemy. It is the spirit of liberty, not of bondage; for where the spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty. In a word, it is the spirit, the fruits of which are love, joy peace long suffering gentleness, goodness, faithfulness, meekness, and temperance (Galatians 5:22-23)

Our experience at the Lord's Table, through the Holy Spirit, brings us to a deeper understanding of the memory of Christ's sacrifice.
