Reflections

SOUND SYSTEM UPGRADE

Over the last several months we have experienced difficulties with our sound quality during Facebook streaming and services in the sanctuary, namely:

- Feed back
- Microphones cutting out
- Poor sound quality

We brought in a consultant who assessed the problems:

- 20+ year old equipment
- The main audio amplifier has only one channel, the other one has failed, so only one speaker in the sanctuary is served
- Several channels of the phonic mixer have failed
- The Digital processor is old and Windows 7 or 10 cannot support or make program changes
- The wireless microphones are outdated
- The analog equalizer for feedback control most likely is not working With our move to include video and audio streaming of services newer equipment will be required for higher quality streaming. At the last Church Board meeting it was decided to proceed with the purchase and installation of the necessary items to upgrade our system. Along with this decision comes the need to pay for the equipment. Donations from members would be helpful and appreciated. You can send or bring in a contribution to the church office.

- AND, a new minister and all the new and exciting things that come with him/ her



24 Hours That Changed the World

What a difference a day makes. You hear people say that phrase all the time. It could not be truer than when talking about the last day of Jesus' life. *24 Hours That Changed the World* written by Adam Hamilton will be the Lenten Study Series starting Tuesday, February 23 through March 30. There will be sessions at 10:00 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. on Zoom.

The study book will help us experience and understand the significance of Jesus' suffering and death like never before. It retraces the day that changed human history in a straightforward yet easy conver-

sational style that speaks to both long-time Christians and those who are simply curious about the story of Christ's crucifixion.

The videos draw on insights from history, archaeology, geography, and the Bible. They take place in the Holy Land. They visit sites where the earth-shaking events took place and walk where Jesus walked along the road that led to the pain and triumph of the cross.

Spotlight on Disciples

Information for this article came from the book, *Disciples: Who We Are & What Holds Us Together* (2019) by Michael Kinnamon and Jan Linn, St. Louis: Christian Board of Publication, pp. 51-53

Understanding Baptism

Kinnamon and Linn help to clarify understanding of baptism with the following points quoted from the text:

- 1) Campbell taught that baptism is "for the remission of sins" (sins actually committed, not guilt inherited from Adam). In baptism, penitent believers receive God's assurance of acceptance and pardon—which is the foundation of holy living.
- 2) Believers' baptism recognizes and upholds people's freedom to affirm faith in Jesus Christ for themselves.
- 3) Baptism is a sign that the person is adopted by God and received into a new family of faith . . . [While not connected] to membership in a local congregation[,] Baptism is a public declaration both of God's forgiveness and of one's incorporation into the church of all times and places. In the words of the Preamble to the Disciples Design, "Through baptism into Christ, we enter into newness of life and are made one with the whole people of God."
