Reflections

Here we are at the end of our time together. I have found that leaving a place is always bittersweet. We have been up the hills together and we have walked through some valleys together. Saying good-bye embraces the laughter and the tears and remembers the beginnings and the endings and everything in between.

The question I leave with you is like my first question, "What is God calling you to do?" This is a question I hope you will continue to revisit over the years as you grow in God's Spirit and Wisdom through prayer and commitment to Christ's service.

Continue to take time to explore your roots as the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and pass your faith stories to newcomers and your young people. When we know where we came from it makes us stronger and bonds us together. Get the history books out and explore your congregational past and celebrate your long history together. What brought people together back then? What brings you together now? Create ways to be together more now that COVID is coming to an end.

Discover new mission opportunities together. What spiritual gifts do you have that can be used in new ways? As you begin to meet in small Bible study groups to pray and ponder the mysteries of God together and to share your faith with each other, the Holy Spirit will guide you to service for Jesus Christ. Renew your baptismal vows to grow in the Christian faith and to further Christ's mission in all the world.

Come to worship together regularly. You have been apart for a very long time now and it's time to celebrate being together as the body of Christ in one place for worship. Remember that you are not coming to a club meeting, but to renew your commitment to following Christ and to encourage your fellow Christians on their journeys. Train up the children in the way they should go by bringing them to church! Remember that the faith formation of each child (and each member old and new) is the responsibility of every member of the congregation.

So, I leave you to seriously consider, "What is God calling you to do?" God will guide you into all truth. I also leave you with the words of Paul (2 Corinthians 13:11-13):

Finally, brothers and sisters, farewell. Put things in order, listen to my appeal, agree with one another, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you. Greet one another with a holy kiss [or elbow bump]. All the saints greet you. The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with all of you.

Thank you for your love, your prayers, your service, your support, and your efforts in the name of Jesus Christ.

Spotlight on Disciples

Information for this article came from the book, *Disciples: Who We Are & What Holds Us Together* (2019) by Michael Kinnamon and Jan Linn, St. Louis: Christian Board of Publication, pp. 56-59.

Recommendations for Disciples

Kinnamon and Linn leave this section on baptism with four recommendations for serious consideration:

1. Rigorous instruction prior to baptism. They remind us that while Disciples have been "long on the act of baptism," we have been "short on the necessary preparation for it." It is important for us to take time to "rethink the extent to which we undermine the importance we place on baptism by inadequate instruction for it."

2. Use strong missional language in the service of baptism. An example (p.57, from the UCC) is "Do you promise, by the grace of God, to be Christ's disciple, to follow in the way of our Savior, to resist oppression and evil, to show love and justice, and to witness to the work and word of Jesus Christ as best you are able? Do you promise, according to the grace given you, to grow in the Christian faith and to be a faithful member of the Church of Jesus Christ, celebrating Christ's presence and furthering Christ's mission in all the World?"

3. Plan for ecumenical participation in services of baptism. We are baptized into Christ. Inviting representatives to our baptisms would celebrate our unity.

4. Take part in services of renewal of Baptismal Vows. The Easter season would be an example for this.

A Final Word: "Through baptism, God lays claim to us and turns us from other gods; but also through baptism, God unites us with the whole Christian family and opens us to persons unlike ourselves and perspectives unlike our own. Discipleship and openness. Bold mission and ecumenical humility. We believe that this is who we are as Disciples, and that it is an identity worth celebrating!"
