The nursery will re-open starting July 4th. We have a sign-up sheet on the table in the hallway. Please consider volunteering to help. We need two people each week.



# **Congregation: Church but Not the Whole Church**

#### Called Out, Called Together

The signs we are seeing lead us to believe Disciples across our church are realizing that our future depends on adapting to rapidly changing circumstances as the one church founders believe we were. While they were hardly perfect or right in their understanding the Bible, their vision of being church represented a fresh call to Christians to be the body of Christ they were intended to be by forsaking all that stood in the way of this call. To continue their work will require a similar courage and boldness, and we believe twenty-first-century Disciples are showing signs of being up to the task, not least because we know today at the congregational level as never before that being church, the ecclesia, the "called out," also means being "called together." This seems to us to capture Campbell's view that a congregations the tangible expression of those who are being shaped into a peculiar people. Christians are still trying to learn how to live in the world, but not be of it, by first learning how to live with each other in harmony and peace.
