

## THOMPSON NEW PASTOR AT FIRST CHRISTIAN CHURCH

Rev. Tara Thompson has always felt a pull toward ministry, and for her, the next step on her journey is serving as pastor at the First Christian Church Disciples of Christ in Emporia, the congregation that welcomed her last month.

Thompson is a Springfield, Mo., native who re-ceived her Bachelor of Arts in Psychology at Missouri Southern State University in Joplin, Mo. She earned her Master of Divinity De-gree from Phillips Theological Seminary in Tulsa. She moved from Salina after serving at the Belmont Boulevard Christian Church.

"I was very involved in the church back at home [in Springfield], also a Disciples of Christ church, from a

She also credits Phil Snider of Springfield as an "amazing mentor and supporter" of her.


Thompson is a mother to a 2-year-old foster child to whom she devotes her free time.

#### The Lord's Supper: One Table Many Guests

#### Presiding at the Table

Unity was also why Campbell insisted that any Christian can preside at the Lord's table. "All Christians are members of the family or house of God," he wrote, and, thus, "are called and constituted a royal and holy priesthood." This understanding of unity is also a part of our identity. As members of Christ's own family, Campbell said, we "are called and constituted a holy and a royal priesthood." Thus, he continued, elders may "bless God for the Lord's table, its loaf and cup, and approach it without fear." This was not a unity of human origin, Campbell believed that the oneness Christians share with one another was the by-product of the bread and cup being commemorative of Jesus' death on the cross. "Ties that spring from eternal love," he wrote, "revealed in blood, and addressed to his senses, draw forth all that is within [Christians] of complacent affection and feeling to those joints heirs with [them] of the grace of eternal life." Campbell, therefore quotes the old chorus, "Bless be the tie that binds our hearts in Christian love."

The oneness of the body of Christ symbolized by the love of God to which the Lord's Supper points is why celebrating it at "every stated meeting" of the church was the "capital proposition" on which Campbell was most insistent. He believed that everything else about "the breaking of the loaf" was preliminary to this purpose. Observance at every gathering was essential to the nurture of the moral health of the Christian community. From what he said about it, it was clear that for Campbell what the Lord's Supper represented made it the heart of Christian worship. For Campbell the bread and the cup were symbols of an act of God, and the institution of the Lord's Supper itself as the which no person other than Jesus could have so established.
