The other day, Nugget and I were leaving Walmart with a cart full of groceries, that almost exceeded my grocery budget, when a woman with 2 young children chased me down and asked for food because her family was in need. I explained to her that I was sorry, but I didn't have any cash on me. When I found out she had transportation, I encouraged her to come to our Food Pantry the next morning.

Rising gas prices. The housing crises. A minimum wage that hasn't been increased in 13 years. These are all factors leading to an increase in homelessness, as well as our churches and food pantries being hit extra hard as more and more people find themselves falling on hard times. I know those of us sitting in the pews are hurting as well.

I share my experience at WalMart with you as reminder for us to always be kind, as we don't know the battles another person is fighting; and also, to let you know there are ways you can help. As food pantries across the nation are being hit extra hard right now, you are invited to give financially to our Food Pantry or to the Pastor's Discretionary Fund. You can also volunteer in our Clothes Closet and Household Hut (there is a sign-up sheet outside the office) as the money raised there, supports our Food Pantry. Most of all, may we pray for one another and love one another as God first loved us.




Family Promise of the Flint Hills is in need of some items for their amazing new space! Please check out their Amazon wish list and other needs. This organization does amazing things for our community!

An Increasing Discomfort with Church

Christie had launched TCG nearly two years earlier out of profound discomfort with what she saw as inappropriate coziness between American faith communities and middle-class values.

"A lot of people living at or below the poverty line don't feel welcome in American churches," Christie says. She heard from lower-income people an awkwardness and even "shame in their inability to afford participation."

Building Church Around Community Need

In a neighborhood with a poverty rate of 30 percent (twice the state's average), TCG launched a no-barrier food pantry and a clothing closet designed for low-income and unsheltered people. TCG didn't require IDs or proof of address for participation, making access easier for visitors.

"A big part of our heart from day one was to wrap around and support the reunification efforts of separated families," Christie says, "and to do that in a loving and trauma-informed space."

When the landlord called to challenge their operation in her building, Christie knew the congregation was not going to abandon the call they felt to welcome people unconditionally. She called Rev. Phil to pray with her. He prayed. But he also introduced her to Disciples who could help.

Not Navigating Alone

However, as they navigate these new challenges, the people of TCG aren't doing so on their own. NCM and local DoC churches have stepped up.

Through Leadership Academy, which is the ministry's annual educational opportunity for pastors and core teams of both established and newly planted churches, Christie has been able to share her knowledge about trauma-informed ministry. Through relationships with local pastors, she has found peer support.
