



- Due to rising food prices, we are in need of donations to the Food Pantry. Please consider how you might help support this vital ministry within our community.

At the end of March of 2022 Ron and Sonya Ihde's son, Jacob Ramirez, was in a horrific motorcycle accident resulting in traumatic brain injury. Since then he has undergone numerous surgeries to repair the damage done in that accident. These last weeks Jacob has been receiving treatment at Madonna Rehabilitation Hospital in Lincoln, Nebraska where he has made remarkable progress, but at 24 years old Jacob still has a long road ahead of him for recovery. But now it is time for him to continue his recovery at home in Emporia. Jacob will be returning to Emporia on July 27th to be back home with Ron, Sonya and their middle school daughter, Faith, where Sonya will continue Jacob's care and treatment full time. Sonya has had to quit her job outside of the home in order to care for Jacob, and while she is grateful she is able to do so, it will still be a tremendous responsibility and burden on her.

This meal train is one way people in this community can be of an assistance to this sweet family during this challenging time of transition.

They have no food allergies and the meal provided will need to be enough to feed three adults. Because of Sonya's responsibility to Jacob there may not always be someone available to answer the door when you drop off your meal. Please just ring the doorbell and leave it by the front door and someone will get it shortly.

Please keep these things in mind:

6:30 p.m. is a great time for meal delivery, though that time can be moved if needed!

PLEASE send your food in disposable containers so that they do not have the added burden of cleaning and returning things to their original owners!!

If your meal is large enough to cover two days or more, then just sign up for two days back to back and when you deliver it the first night, just indicate that to them in some way.

Feel free to add on a breakfast or snack if you so desire, but that is in no way expected! The dinner itself will be so appreciated!

If cooking is not an option for you, then gift cards to local restaurants would be most appreciated as well!
