Reflection

Dear Friends,

We had a great experience with the first half of our Appreciative Inquiry on Sunday, January 22. Next Sunday, January 29, we'll complete the second half of this exercise. As we finished up yesterday, the group decided to modify worship again to include prayers and communion followed by the Appreciative Inquiry. This second half of this exercise calls for your imagination and creativity to be engaged. I hope you will come with both ready to contribute to the ongoing conversation.

In case you missed it, we began with paired interviews framed with this opening statement:

We find ourselves, like many churches across the country, at a pivotal point in time. Aging congregations, shrinking numbers, and stretched too-thin budgets leave us asking what comes next. What we know is that all of us have found connection, compassion, and spiritual grounding/growth as a result of being a part of this congregation, and none of us wants to lose that. We have lived the benefit of such a community; we know the value and want to continue to share that with others. At a time when transitions among community institutions come at an exponentially increasing pace, perhaps it is time for us to step back and explore together what we are being called to now. What does our transition look like? How might we increase our relevance and impact in the Emporia community? How might we expand our circle of connection, compassion, and spiritual growth in ways that reach community members where they are? Instead of focusing on holding on to what seems to be slipping away, our conversations today will be about possibility. This interview invites you to tap into the non-material heart of our congregation and faith, and draw upon your creative thinking and knowledge about the community so we can explore how we might keep that heart vital and serving our deepest purpose.

This statement continues to frame our next steps. Next Sunday, we'll begin with a recap of last Sunday's work and then continue with the next steps:

- 1. Dream create shared images of a preferred future.
- 2. Design innovate ways to create the shared future.
- 3. Destiny live out your design and make changes as needed.

Please plan to participate in this energizing conversation.



2022 was a year of growth and adaptation.

In 2022, Family Promise of the Flint Hills switched shelter models and launched new programs to be able to serve more people in the community. We served **35** families, comprising 119 individuals. **17** of those families were served in the Prevention program that we launched in May and 18 were served in the shelter program. Family Promise of the Flint Hills was

able to successfully help 84% of our families maintain or gain stable housing.

Important Data from 2022

Average cost to shelter a family: \$1,770.31 Average cost to put a shelter family into housing: \$1,203.46 Total nights of shelter provided: 696 nights Average length of shelter stay for families: 37 days Average cost of prevention services for a family: \$685.61
